## THE MAJOR IN SOCIOLOGY AND SOCIAL THOUGHT

Note that SOC 101 does not count toward the major, and is not a prerequisite for upper-level sociology courses.

## 12 hours as follows:

- SOC 306 (Cultural Anthropology) or 319 (Comparative Human Societies) 3 hrs
- SOC 390 (Research Methods) 3 hrs
- SOC 391 (Emergence of Sociological Thought) 3 hrs
- SOC 317 (Interaction & Social Definition) or PSY 341 (Social Psychology) 3 hrs

At least 15 additional hours in SOC or other approved courses, at least 3 of which must be at the 400 level. (Any courses explicitly listed under SST in the published schedule for a given term are considered approved; consult director regarding other requests.)

A senior paper (normally one written for a major course), presentation, and comprehensive examination. Current information on how to meet these requirements is available from the program director.

Total credit hours: 27

A statistics course may be counted toward the major if the student is not pursuing a second major or minor which requires statistics (examples: biology, business, economics, psychology).

Additional requirements for departmental honors:

- 3.7 or higher in-major GPA (Please note: 2014-15 Catalog "3.8" is a misprint.)
- Performance at currently defined minimum level on comprehensive exam (consult director)
- Senior paper at least 20 pages, not including notes, refs
- A-level grades on senior paper and presentation

## THE MINOR IN SOCIOLOGY

Note that SOC 101 does not count toward the major, and is not a prerequisite for upper-level sociology courses.

Psychology majors who minor in sociology may substitute another SOC course for 390. Counting non-SOC courses for the minor will normally not be permitted, but exceptions are at the discretion of the program director. Exceptions may be specified in the published schedule for a given term. PSY 341 (Social Psychology), REL 373 (Religion Society & Culture), and REL 374 (American Religious Landscape) are always approved for the minor.
